

A RESOLUTION

urging repeal of our local governments' pro-homosexual policies

WHEREAS, the Platform of the Republican Party of Texas declares homosexuality is a chosen behavior that is contrary to the fundamental, unchanging truths that have been ordained by God in the Bible, recognized by our nation's founders, and shared by the majority of Texans;

WHEREAS, the practice of homosexuality tears at the fabric of society and contributes to the breakdown of the family unit;

WHEREAS, homosexuality must not be presented as an acceptable alternative lifestyle, in public policy, nor should family be redefined to include homosexual couples;

WHEREAS, homosexual, bisexual, and transgendered persons already have constitutionally protected civil rights—such persons have applied at all levels of government for special rights based merely upon the behavior and not upon unchanging characteristics such as race, color, etc.;

WHEREAS, the San Antonio City Council on September 5, 2013 passed an ordinance that uses taxpayer dollars to:

- Allow men to freely use the women's restrooms, locker rooms, and changing facilities
- Gag any city board or commission member from speaking against homosexual behavior or be subjected to removal from the group
- Subject businesses run by people of faith to criminal penalties and expensive lawsuits if they refuse to provide services that conflict with religious beliefs relating to homosexual behavior.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that there should be NO granting of special legal entitlements or creation of special status for homosexual behavior. The Republican Party of Bexar County urges the repeal of San Antonio and Bexar County ordinances that have given special rights to homosexuals, and the repeal of city and county's taxpayer-funded, marriage-dishonoring "domestic partner" benefits programs for government employees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the preceding resolution does not occur, that the Party urges voters to "throw the rascals out" and elect officials who will carry out the resolution.
